Early Intervention...

EI **continues** to **see** an **increase** in **referrals** to the program.

Currently – **195** children in program **146** eligible **49** Childfind/Intake

EI has **contracted** with **Family Health West** for **service providers** to **work** with our **families**. So far they have been **able** to **provide** us with **PT** and **SLP services**. **Mary Johnson** our SLP and **Amanda Pesta** OT have also **moved** over to **Family Health West** but **continue** to work with Early Intervention **families**. We are also still **offering Telehealth** to **families** as an option for services.


Children who are being **evaluated** for **services** in Early Intervention, the **evaluations** are **completed** by the School District's **Childfind Team**. They are tasked with **determining** a percentage of **delay** and providing that **information** to the **EI team**. The EI team will then **determine** if the **child** is **eligible** for **services**. At the State level there is some discussion of moving Childfind away from the School District and giving it to Early Intervention. This would mean EI would need to complete their own evaluations of children referred. These evaluations require a transdisciplinary team of at least 2 providers. At this time there has not been a final decision made regarding this move, and everything is still in the preliminary stage. The State is currently completing a study as well as gathering data and feedback from CCB'S before making any final decisions. With all these necessary steps and other details to work out it is not expected that any changes will occur for several months if not longer
